2. Where to Play

Chesapeake Bay Wine Trails

There are 12 vineyards across the peninsula between the Rappahannock and Potomac Rivers; two are located within Virginia's River Realm. Beginning in Irvington is The Dog and Oyster Vineyard. Just 5 miles away is Good Luck Cellars in Kilmarnock. The entire trail features an oyster crawl in November to sample our native bi-valve as part of Virginia's Official Oyster Month!

Boutique Shopping

Step back into Mayberry but with upscale shopping in the quaint small towns of Kilmarnock, Irvington, and Urbanna. Pedestrian friendly, operated by local merchants and shop keepers, you will make a friend at these stops.

Deltaville Maritime Museum

Houses 2 Antique Boats: "The F.D. Crockett," a restored buyboat and "The Explorer," a reproduction of the 1608 Captain John Smith's shallop that was the first English settlers used for the exploration of the Chesapeake Bay.
